The book details three generations of an Italian-American family in New York during the first three-quarters of the twentieth century, narrated by Ralph's sister, Regina.



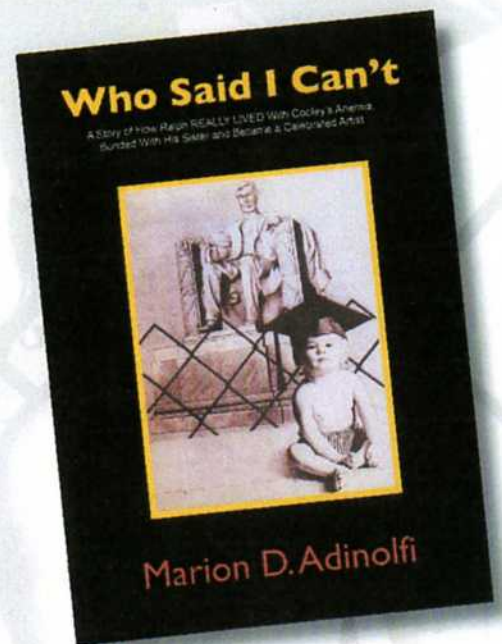
Marion Darlyne Adinolfi was born on 16 October 1941, Bronx, New York, USA, to Frances and Calogero Moscato.
